



Left: Lord Krishna`s incarnation as Nrsimhadeva kills Hiranyakashipu.

Bhakta Scott On chanting the holy names

I close my eyes and centre my being. Drawing the morning air deep inside my lungs, I prepare my mind and body for this most sacred of ancient practices.

The air is cold as it rushes into my tired body, replenishing every atom within. Deep inside

my core I feel the rush of blood as the life-giving *sakti* electrifies every cell and opens me up to the thoughts of Lord Krsna. The mind rattles and shakes with invading random thoughts, beginning its chaos of unfiltered predictions, doubts and worries. Ringing my small *puja* bell, the internal waters gently subside and calm. Lighting a candle and some sandalwood incense I prostate myself before the beautiful deities of the Lord. In full supplication I softly begin the Pancha-Tattva *mantra*:

śrī-kṛṣṇa-caitanya prabhu-nityānanda,

śrī-advaita gadādhara śrīvāsādi-gaura-bhakta-vṛnda

Immediately upon finishing this auspicious verse, I feel a familiar vibrational change deep within my being; an alchemical change that reverberates and lifts my mind from the constant battle of self-doubt and illusion. Primed, I offer water in a copper vessel to Sri Krsna. I take one more deep breath, infusing myself with lifegiving oxygen in preparation for the daily offering of the *mahamantra*.

Holding my *japa mala* bag, I reach inside to be greeted with the old familiar touch of wooden *Tulasi* beads. The touch is always comforting, like a pre-cursor to the bliss that can come while chanting. I mentally remind myself of the importance of and focus required to perform *japa*.

Briefly closing my eyes I remember that there are a multitude of forms of Lord Krsna each with Their pastimes; especially sweet are those in Vrndavana. Opening my eyes, I remember that Krsna is everything that I can perceive with my senses and beyond; impossible to understand with these limited human perceptions. My mind drifts to the *Virata-rupa* as my eyes gaze out of my window. The blue sky, the trees the hills that I see are all emanations of His divine majesty. All of it...good, bad, mundane and profound.... Everything is Krsna's energy.

Memories of my first interaction with true devotees come flooding into my mind and the vital lessons of bhakti are thus imparted. Each one of us are like a single drop of water in the magnificent ocean. We are the same in quality but not in quantity. Every drop of rain eventually flows back to the mother ocean - our source,

our true destination; back to the reservoir of real love and endless compassion.

With my mind fixed, I utter the sacred names of God, the great means of spiritual deliverance for this age of ignorance and conflict. The *mahamantra* fills every cell, every atom within my body and without, the purifying sound vibrates:

Hare Krsna Hare Krsna, Krsna Krsna Hare Hare Hare Rama Hare Rama, Rama Rama Hare Hare

With raised self-awareness and the discipline of daily practice, I attempt to concentrate on the syllables. The monkey mind rattles away but I open my heart to Krsna and push random thoughts to one side. They can wait in the queue for another time. They do not serve any purpose now other than to distract me from connecting with the spiritual world. Scientific eternal discoveries have uncovered proof that the heart has "brain" cells and it's own nervous system. Breathing deeply, I picture my heart and Paramatma within

"The Supreme Lord is situated as *Paramātmā* in everyone's heart, and it is from Him that all activities are initiated. The living entity forgets everything of his past life, but he has to act according to the direction of the Supreme Lord, who is witness to all his work. Therefore he begins his work according to his past deeds. Required knowledge is supplied to him, and remembrance is given to him, and he forgets, also, about his past life. Thus, the Lord is not only all-pervading; He is also localized in every individual heart. He awards the different fruitive results." *Bg* 15.15 ppt.

Attempting to place all my attention on Krsna within my heart, I continue the *maha-mantra*. I first think of my *asrama*, my family and friends.... then beyond that to our community of Vaisnavas. But better that I just simply try to hear the holy names.

There is so much suffering everywhere, at all times, due to the sinfulness of people covered by ignorance, illusion and attachment to selfish desires. We as living *jivas* have false notions due to the covering over of our true nature by *Maya*. This expresses itself as suffering that cannot be relieved by any material means.

But there is real hope and fulfilment on our journey back home. The sacred Vedas provide us, through the words of great sages, knowledge of Sri Krsna - a means to wipe away the dust of the ignorance that covers the mirror of the soul and drags us from our only mission...our return to Krsna's service.

Inside the heart of all living beings, there is a dormant desire for loving service to Krsna. We all experience material fear and anxiety due to being separate from Krsna yet we now have a lifeline back to Him...All we have to do is call His names with pure hearts, focused attention and real love.

Spiritual awareness should grow each time we chant without offences. If offences are made then the continued repetition of the holy names is the only hope for us. If we chant sincerely, attraction to chanting will naturally grow. Watering the roots of a plant produces growth. Slowly the branches and leaves will reach towards the sun but the journey is beset with obstacles, material life is precarious. However, constant practice of *bhakti-yoga* strengthens one's resolve. Reciprocation from Krsna encourages one's spiritual growth. As the neophyte continues in devotional service the association of devotees inspires his spiritual practice so he becomes stronger and more fixed in his determination to serve the Lord.

Through our devotional service in the form of the repetition of the holy names of Krsna, the creeper of *bhakti* grows and eventually blossoms and bears fruit at the lotus feet of the Lord. The creeper of devotion is under constant threat from all sides by *Maya* but mercifully our inner guide, *Paramatma*, remains with us, always ready to guide us out of darkness; the enlightenment of knowledge of Krsna can bring us safely back to Godhead, to Krsna-*loka*.

With deep reverence for this process, complete your rounds and preach the message of the science of self-realization out in the world. Spread the *mantra* far and wide and uphold the mission of Srila Prabhupada and Lord Caitanya Mahaprabhu.

Through sincere practice we can overcome our illusory self and be situated in our true constitutional position as an eternal servant

of Krsna. The timeless words of Vedic scriptures, namely *Bhagavad-gita As It Is* and the topmost scripture *Srimad Bhagavatam*, with commentaries by Vaisnavas, show the path of pure devotional service which is the only way home, back to the Supreme Person, the Absolute Truth, Lord Krsna.

This month's recipe
Wheaten Bread
by Deva



Made throughout the island of Ireland, this bread is made with baking soda rather than yeast and does not need to be kneaded or left to rise. This recipe is ideal if you are short of time.

Ingredients

235g wholemeal flour

235g plain flour

30q oats

- 1 heaped teaspoon salt
- 1 heaped teaspoon bicarbonate of soda

250 ml buttermilk or 125ml dairy or plant-based milk mixed with125ml water plus a tablespoon of lemon juice

70ml sunflower oil

Method

Pre-heat your oven to 180C and grease a baking tray. While it warms up, combine all the dry ingredients in a bowl. (If you like, you can adjust the flour ratio, using more wholemeal flour.) If you don't have buttermilk, measure out 125ml of milk and 125 ml water and add a tablespoon of lemon juice. Set it aside for few minutes.

Add the oil to the dry ingredients in the bowl and combine gently - it will start to look a bit like breadcrumbs.

buttermilk/curdled bbA the Mix milk gradually. it carefully - this dough should not be kneaded. Once it has come together, it will be quite soft and wet but not sticky; similar to scone dough texture. I have found that the dough can sometimes thirstier than expected so don't be afraid to add some more liquid if it's a bit on the dry side.

Shape the dough into a round and place on the greased tray. If you'd like to tidy the appearance up a bit, you can do this with damp hands. Cut a cross on the top with a knife. You can sprinkle some oats and seeds on the top before baking. (You can also make this in a standard 2lb loaf tin.)

Bake for an hour and leave to sit for fifteen minutes before slicing. It's lovely eaten fresh and it makes very nice toast on subsequent days.
